

## Memorials in St George's Church, Arreton

### South Aisle, West to east

1. Mrs Mary Hill, wife of Lieutenant Colonel Justly Hill and 2<sup>nd</sup> dau. Of lat Robert Worsley of Pidford d.14 June 1792 aged 40.
2. Rev, Sir Henry Worsley Holmes, Bart., 3<sup>rd</sup> son of Robert Worsley, late of Pidford d 14. April 1811 in 56<sup>th</sup> year.
3. Sir Leonard Thomas Worsley Holmes, Bart., Recorder and M.P. of the Borough of Newport, last Baronet of the ancient family of Worsley of this island d.10 January 1825 in his 38<sup>th</sup> year, leaving a widow and 3 infant daughters of whom the youngest Isabella was buried a few days after her father.
4. Ann Redston Worsley, widow of Sir Leonard Worsley Holmes Bart. Born 8 April 1793 d. 4 April 1857
5. Richard Fleming Worsley Holmes, Esq. . 2<sup>nd</sup> son of Rev. Henry Worsley Holmes, Bart., and the Honorable Lady Worsley Holmes. M.P. for Newport I.W. Drowned in the river Hamble 26 July 1814 aged 22 years.

William Searle born at Stone in this parish, died a bachelor, 1 Feb 1595 aged 59. Left £100 to the parish of Arreton.
8. Annie Whale, 28 years organist of this church 1884- 1912
9. Susanna, late wife of William Griffin, Vicar. Buried 21 Dec 1731 aged 78 in the churchyard.  
William Griffin, buried by her 26 Dec 1732

David Wavell, Gent, born 3 Dec 1629. d. 6 July 1714. Elizabeth his wife d 6 Jan 1699
11. Sarah Jane, wife of Frederick Roach of Arreton and dau. Of Daniel and Dionysia Black, d 22 Feb. 1844, aged 32, whose remains were buried I the family vault at Collingbourne Ducis, Wilts.
12. Frederick Roach of Arreton Manor d 22 Aug. 1882 aged 81.  
Elizabeth, his younger sister, widow of William Foquett, Major M.E.IC 2<sup>nd</sup> Bombay European Regt. D 16 April 1888
13. 10 Nov 1628. Here was buried the body of Edward Harbert of Birchmore, who died 9 November 1628

17. Here lyeth the body of Thomas lisle of Briddlesford, Esq., who died 17 Dec 1621  
in his 70<sup>th</sup> year.

18. Captain Henry Geary, son of Commander Thomas Geary R.N. of Newport IW b  
28 Nov 1773 killed in action at Rolica, 18 Aug. 1808  
France, his wife, dau of Benjamin Jolliffe, Esq., MD of Broadfields in this parish,  
born 8 September 1783, d at East Sheen Surrey 18 Sept 1862

Also their children

Henry, Captain R.A. born 4 Oct 1802 died at sea 13 Jan 1845

Frances, wife of Rev, James Jolliffe of Padmore, IW who was born 22 April 1804,  
died at Stoke Charity, Hants 14 May 1836

Frederick Augustus of Inland Revenue Office, born 19 Dec 1805 died at Putney,  
Surrey 3 Nov 1854

Mary, born 29 May 1808, died 17 April 1830 at Camberwell, Surrey

Also Lt..General Sir Henry L.C.Geary KCB Colonel commanding R.A. 1837-1918,  
son of said Frederick Augustus Geary

And of his sons Lt. Henry G.F.Geary, RA 1870-97

Elizabeth his wife d March 1717 in 65<sup>th</sup> year

20. Captain George Oglander of Hale interred 8 May 1717 aged 66

21 Robert Bell, Esq., of Stickworth d 4 Feb 1841 aged 61  
Mary Jerdein Bell, his relict d 8 July 1850 aged 77  
Isabella Halson d 13 July 1832 aged 15



34. Charles Halson of Stickworth, nephew and heir of Robert Bell, d at Shanklin 7 Sept 1871 aged 76  
Christian, his wife, d 30 July 1871 aged 75

35. Charles Augustus Halson M.A. eldest son of Charles and Christian Halson d 10 Nov 1859 aged 40  
Olympia Mary, his widow, died at Stickworth 17 July 1892 aged 72]

36. Charles Burland Esq., eldest son of Rev.C.I.Burland M.A and Mary Halson his wife b 18 Feb 1861 d 27 June 1924

Around corner on North Wall of central Chancel

37 Charles Isherwood Burland M.A. formerly curate in charge of Arreton, 1<sup>st</sup> Vicar of St Saviour, Shanklin. Born 24 Dec 1830 d 16 Feb 1898  
Mary his wife, eldest daughter of Charles Halson Esq of Stickworth born 3 April 1830 d 5 May 1908  
Erected by their three sons, Charles Burland M.D., William Burland M.A. and Arthur Burland, who were all born at Arreton Vicarage.

Sir John Oglander noted the following tombs in the 1630's

At the upper end of the middle aisle

A. Anno Domini August 30<sup>th</sup> 1623. Here was buried Margaret Mather, wife of Henry Mather, who was buried at the West End of this stone April 4<sup>th</sup> 1623

B. Under a blue stone in the Chancel, as you go up to the Communion table Mrs Dousabel Milles, wife of Mr George Milles of Heasley Anno Domini 1603

C On South Wall of South Chancel

Mr Richard Cooke of Budbridge, Captain of Sandham Castle, died 2<sup>nd</sup> year of Queen Elizabeth
